1. How would you interpret “tighten your bow string”?
2. What is the problem with ambition that is unguarded, pursued apart from Jesus?
 - a. What does it mean to “steward your desires” well?
3. Hard work (or grit) is important to success.
 - a. How can you be a hard worker without being consumed by it?
 - b. Would you say hard work (or grit) is still esteemed to the average American?
4. Has the model of hard work and focused/balanced ambition provided abundance in your “fields”?
5. How do you balance success with humility?
6. We're all tempted to put off difficult tasks until later. Can you share some personal, practical tips for fighting procrastination?
7. We all have to pursue making money.
 - a. Do you think your personal wealth has made you less dependent on God?
 - b. How do you balance dependence on God with the pursuit of wealth?
8. One way to fuel ambition properly is to be a lifelong learner.
 - a. What are you learning now?
 - b. How do you motivate yourself to continue to learn?
