Bible Summary

Ecclesiastes 9:1-6
Death's End

Ecclesiastes presents death in an agnostic light. The author, throughout portions of his book, is unsure if the spirit of man goes up while the spirit of the beast goes down (Eccl. 3:21). He hints at the predominate view today called naturalism. The idea that when we die that is the end. Investigating the rest of Scripture presents a different and hopeful view that enables believers to have a strength that can overcome suffering, death and evil.
