Bible Summary

Daniel 3:12 The Cultural Hot Seat

Babylon like all cultures seeks to shape people after its image. In Daniel 3:12 we see three universal cultural pressures. The first is nationalism which makes an idol of a nation and demands blind allegiance. Second is pluralism or the idea that everyone can decide for themselves because there are no objective truths. Finally is worship. Every culture has their idealized image and it beckons the citizens to bow and worship this image.
