Bible Questions & Application

(These are meant to aid in facilitating conversation.
There is no obligation to run through **every** listed question.)

1. How did Sunday’s message challenge your thinking?
2. What do you think is the root of “me-ism”? Why is it so culturally prevalent now?
3. One of the ramifications of “me-ism” is loneliness.
 - a. Are you more lonely than you are letting on?
 - b. How can we as a community group fight this?
4. In a culture that elevates individual truth, feelings are often weaponized. What is the proper/biblical perspective on feelings?
5. What does it take to cultivate an environment in which grace and truth can be spoken into each other’s lives? (Proverbs 3:3-4)
6. “Hard today is healthy tomorrow.” What does that mean to you?
7. Jesus was the ultimate “border crosser”. How can we become more like Jesus in that way?
8. How do our interactions with people change when we remember that our struggle is not against flesh and blood but against the powers of darkness and spiritual forces of evil (Eph. 6:12)?
