Bible Summary

Daniel 6:1-13 Faith is

Daniel's life is defined by his faith but his faith looks different than what we may assume. Faith isn't simply believing everything will work out or that you will get whatever you want if you have enough faith. It's quite the opposite. It is Daniel's faith that gets him thrown in the lion's den. It is his faith that causes trouble. Daniel 6 (and Daniel 3) are manuals on what faith is when it is truly lived out--that often it is faith that gets believers thrown into fiery furnaces and lion's dens.

- 7. Daniel prayed toward Jerusalem, focusing his faith on the future. How does that translate to us today? (Col. 3:1-4)
- 8. Compare yourself to Daniel.
 - a. In what ways are you like him or not like him?
 - b. What can we take away from Daniel's example?
