

## **Bible Summary**

Series - Ignorant

Topic - Old Testament Spirit

Everyone in church has an idea of how the Spirit is supposed to work in the life of the believer. Much of this history is based on two important New Testament passages. While we must learn from these passages, the Jewish believers in Acts 2 already had a file for how the Spirit would work. Peter in explaining the Acts 2 Pentecost moment says what is happening was foretold by Joel the prophet in the Old Testament. We need to recover this lost file and then use the New Testament testimony to add information to that file.

Scriptures– 1 Corinthians 12:1, 10:31; Acts 2; Hebrews 13:8; Genesis 1:1-2, 41:38-41; Exodus 31:1-5; 2 Thessalonians 2:7-8

1. In whom does the Spirit of God work?
2. Share an example of how God brought order out of chaos in your life.
3. Did it surprise you that God's Spirit is in the secular and not just in the sacred and holy things?
  - a. What happens when we leave God out of the so-called secular realm?
  - b. How can we be more intentional about inviting God into times in our lives that are confusing?
4. How can God use the Spirit-filled believer to minister to the secular world (e.g. Joseph in Egypt)?
5. What would need to change if we remembered the world is a battleground and not a playground?
6. As God is working the chaos out of our lives, how can we be patient in that process?
7. How does Sunday's teaching challenge your idea of finding *God's will* for your life? (1 Cor. 10:31)
