Nehemiah 8

Summary – Nehemiah has moved the ball forward as far as his gifting will allow. He has rebuilt the wall and hung the gates. He has formed the crucible for a revival. He realizes his lap is concluding and hands the baton off to Ezra, the pastor, to now renew the people. In chapter 8, we have possibly the oldest account of an actual corporate worship time of God's people. We see key ingredients that remain as true today as they were in 5th century BC.
