Matthew 5:43-48

In Matthew 5 Jesus makes six statements clarifying the Kingdom. In this week's teaching He makes the hardest of all requests; He tells His followers to not only love their neighbors, but to love their enemies. He defines love as praying, greeting, and doing good like their heavenly Father.

Community Group Questions

Introduction

Pray (vs. 44)

- What are the benefits/challenges of praying for your enemies?
- How does prayer change our hearts and set us free?

Greet (vs. 47)

- "The Gospels are Jesus having dinner with all the wrong people."
- How can we become better at humanizing and not demonizing people?

Do Good Like God (vs. 45,48)

- "Do I not destroy my enemies by making them my friends?"
 Abraham Lincoln
- How can you become better at making the "sun rise" on your enemies?
