Why God?

Job

- What's the difference between "child-like faith" (Ps. 23) and "fidelity of faith" (Ps. 22)?
- "There is a kind of faith that only grows in the darkness."
- Like Job, have you ever been in a season where you seriously questioned God's faithfulness?
- How can indifference towards God develop?

Jeremiah

- Why would God allow the wicked to prosper?
- Why does God allow Jeremiah chapter 20 to be in the Bible?
- "God can handle what I'm bringing; I can handle whatever God is bringing."
- Why is the purity of our faith likened to gold in the Bible?

Closing

- "Don't forsake in the dark what God has shown you in the light."
- What is God's purpose in our tests?
- Is God your goal?
